Reports

Dave Cockshell - Playgrounds

Dave C, Taron, Jenny, Roger, David W and M-I helped take down most of the playground this afternoon. Two platforms to be tackled tomorrow morning. The contractor will pull the posts on Monday. Matt will bring the big trailer tomorrow to move the big items to RARE. Haley (Town of Gawler) visited. President Darryl also popped by. Dave will speak with Peter Baur from Mt Barker tomorrow and will return the tools. Mt Barker are aiming to send 6 playgrounds to Timor Leste.

Steve McLachlan – Youth & Christmas Parade

Gawler & District Interactor Taya White has gone on the One and All voyage. Participants have had the joy of experiencing crewing a sailing vessel amidst the full range of weather!

Jenny and Steve have been liaising with the group organising the Christmas Parade – ToG have arranged the traffic Mgt plan – looking for 4 volunteers during the event. They want us to have qualifications to do this, which many have from what was done prior to the airshow. We will be stopping traffic when the floats are going past. 2nd Dec from Lunchtime to 7pm. Floats are meeting at APEX park.

Rotary is Fun Ute booked for Christmas Parade. Wheels in Motion car may follow in tandem (with *occupants in Christmas gear??*). We could have walking signage in front as well. Need to have brain storming – Darryl suggested 17th during committees. Pageant Briefing Nov 21 to discuss final arrangements. Christmas Display lights will be switched on at sunset on the night following the parade. There will be stalls in APEX park to encourage people to stay and watch the lighting up of the Christmas Display. Food options are being discussed – sausage sizzle/gourmet?

Need to arrange set up of the Christmas Display by the Friday night before the display. Andrew Halford is going to be the champion of the Christmas Display. Footy club will also assist with heavy lifting!

Jenny – Member Profile

Members were asked to fill out a questionnaire. If you don't like the online version, Jenny has a paper copy which people can use if they prefer. This is to help new members get to know everyone

Ian Chase – President Elect

Need to get Board together prior to the AGM. Please see Ian if you would like to be on the Board, otherwise Ian will be headhunting members precluded by a tap on the shoulder.

Guest Speaker Duncan Power – International Projects update

Cycle for Recycling project – Global Grant is ready for submission. Project will collect plastics for recycling into bricks, plus micro financing for shops that collect recyclables and provide goods with low impact packaging. 3 components of the project 1) Eco Brick Hub – testing of technology and is almost complete, 2) Sustainable Micro-finance – support eco sari-sari store loan product aimed at reducing plastic in the store, replace sachet products with refill alternatives. Challenge is changing customer habits – needs to save people money. 3) Eco Store – 50 refill items stocks, 10% reduction in cost, 38% reduction in plastic waste. Update from Khnao Po High School Library - \$2000 enabled purchase of new books and equipment. \$1000 from RC Gawler Light & \$1000 from RC in Capalaba (QLD).

Solar Water Project - \$1500 District Grant to purchase solar panels to make purified water. Covid intervened. Getting a secure location for the solar panels was a challenge. Mr Sokhum – Chicken outgrower – continues to go well with most batches of chickens having high survival rate which provides a good income

Three English Language Scholarships – the students commenced university in 2023. Scholarships we provided gave them confidence for further education. Kon Kea – studying accounting, Socheat – studying Khmer Literature & wants to be a teacher, Sokhem – studying English Literature – her English is excellent and she also wants to be a teacher.

Our Legacy - \$24,000 to fund international projects. Feedback from 5 members – sustainability, education, partnership with other clubs, collaboration with Rotaract club in Siem Reap. Continue with English Scholarships – how to we ensure a lasting impact on their lives. Business education? Environmental Sustainability? Vocational Training? Hospitality Training?

English & Vocational Scholarship Fund Cambodia “Basic Education – reduce gender disparity in Education”

Can we structure a fund that we can use over many years?

Jenny – likes the idea of scholarships continuing. Vocational aspect is good – the provides other options outside of University. Ongoing impact, sustainable.

Rob – also likes the idea of a Vocational Training Scholarship. It is not that expensive, so you can touch more people.

Deanne – also prefers Vocational Scholarship – more practical approach to set people up for the future.

Jenny added – steer away from traditional roles for women – STEM related, not the lower paid roles

Dave C – RAWCS has the Sanderson Trust ~\$80,000 in the trust which is not being used – we could potentially access some funds as part of this programme

Roger – is there a timeframe which we have to spend the legacy over. Duncan – there is no time limit, managed well it could last a long time. We could seek ways to add to it further.

Ian Curtis – there are good options for vocational training in Siem Reap.

Grant B – look outside the traditional roles. How can we expand their world?

Deanne – where have the people come from that we are funding? Duncan – generally in rural areas of Cambodia as they tend to be more disadvantaged because of their distance from schools etc.

Steve McL – Could we do a limited number of scholarships each year to make it last longer? 3 or 4 per year. Once we get results, we can seek support from other clubs to extend the programme.

Course Options – ACE course which was what we used last time – 3 semesters A\$1000. If we add English and Introductory A\$1600 followed by a second year in advanced vocational training \$1000.

Duncan – we just need to ensure the women we support are likely to persist with their education (and not get married young or going back to plant rice). DanaAsia has a person on the ground who can make this assessment & we look for outside references – including from the teachers at the school. For vocational training – the school we propose to use has a robust process.

Roger thanked Duncan for his presentation and his work that he does in this area which is making an impact in the International Projects area.
