# 3 Chairperson / President Darryl Opening Remarks

Meeting 1388 opened at 7:30pm by President Darryl who welcomed visitors.

RC Elizabeth – guest speaker tomorrow night speaking about Lymphodema

Gawler Rotaract Satellite Club – 1 meeting of a working group. Meeting tomorrow with Cody about next steps – several events starting in July inviting people to participate. Salisbury City Rotaract will be the sponsor club.

Zone 8 Pilot – establishment meeting 2 weeks ago. 12 clubs in our community group. Ian has updated our brochure which details our projects and sent it out. 2 replies received.

#### 4 Rotary Information – Bernie

Polio eradication – in 2000 Bernie presented to Rotary Groups and he was non plussed as he thought polio was gone. His dad had polio. Also went to school with a child impacted. He remembered lining up for vaccinations. In Cambodia in 2009 there was a child in a wheel chair who had contracted polio. 2 brother from Caltowie adapted the iron lung to be portable and was distributed across the British empire. Paul Alexander lived in an iron lung for over 70 years after contracting polio. He had a law degree and practiced in Texas. He joined Rotary and became a speaker about polio eradication. He passed away in March 2024. No WPV cases since October until this week when there were 2 in Pakistan. Rotary is a major contributor to the eradication of polio. Bernie said he is no longer non plussed

#### 5 Guest Speaker – Vera – Youth Exchange 2017/18

Vera graduated from school after returning home. Covid meant she did not sit exams. She completed a bachelor's degree in pharmacy. She has moved out of home and is working in a histology laboratory. Vera is trying to get on to Board of Uni association. She was president for one year. Vera is in Australia for 6 weeks and will visit the Whitsundays and Perth before going home. Vera still gets our bulletin each week and found out she was guest speaker after reading it in the bulletin!!

Steve asked relationship status. Inappropriate question??? The is someone on the scene at the moment.

Matthew – how much Rotary involvement since she returned home? She spoke at the club, but it was not a good experience and so she did not return. Study and work has also got in the way of attending projects. Vera's family has hosted two exchange students.



Steve Arthur asked who her host families were: In the following order: Steve and Jenny Redden, Matthew and Jane Sanders, Rob Eley & Sandy Nicholson, Steve & Julie McLachlan

Diane asked where Vera is from:- Switzerland, near the German border. Currently living in Zurich.

Rob asked about future plans: Vera is starting a Master's degree in September. Two placements to do this year. Goal is to work in a hospital pharmacy. Also interested in work in the body which approves drugs. There are many employment opportunities for Pharmacists.

Steve Mc asked is Vera has to pay for her university degree? Vera said there are some fees, but they are not very expensive.

Mark asked what Vera took home from Australia? The slang language! A lot about life, including being more relaxed to approach people and speak with them – this is not what is done in Switzerland. Shapes and Boost Juice. Becoming more self-reliant and courageous. An Australian accent (well one that is noticeable in Switzerland).

Vera really appreciates catching up with people since coming back – even after 5 years. Vera has visited Xavier and spoken with the staff. She loved the year and recommended to her friends to consider doing an exchange. She appreciates all the support from everyone during the year.

Peter H asked if Vera was in contact with other students from the exchange? Only a few - a couple of other Swiss exchange students and one French student. But if they are in the same country they catch up.

Richard Tucker presented Vera with a mug as a token of our appreciation for her presentation.

## 6.4 Shelterbags – Richard

Shelterbags should have arrived in Melbourne today. They will land at RARE soon.

Call from secretary RC Tea Tree Gully – they have ordered some bags and would like to have a look at the Shelterbags next week.

Richard attended the Red Room meeting. Statistics – since April 2022 when the Red Room started. +20% homeless in the stated in past 12 months. 60+ people sleeping rough, but significant reduction in crime involving homeless people. 7 people have obtained accommodation 19 people have used the lockers. 8 rough sleepers currently + 6 sleeping in vehicles. 4 of the rough sleepers have pets -which costs more money. Less people visibly sleeping rough –



most shelter bags have moved on from Gawler, some have come back and been re-used. 2nd bank of 8 lockers being installed. Some of the conditions for use of lockers are being tightened up – more secure, locked at night – to prevent congregation at night which has resulted in some complaints from residents.
