Taron - Guest Speaker & International Exchange Student

Taron, pictured above at the recent community BBQ in Reid (a suburb of Gawler) entertained club members and guests as meeting 1369's guest speaker.

The club discovered many fascinating insights and the secret behind Taron's blossoming BBQ skills. In Taiwan barbecues have become a traditional part of the Chinese Moon Festival since a local BBQ sauce manufacturer ran a series of ads in 1986 encouraging people to BBQ on the festive day. Groups of family and friends enjoy BBQs at home, in restaurants and on the street. Some of the things people prepare on the grill include baby corn, king oyster mushrooms, beef, clams, fish coated in salt and Taiwan's famous sweet garlic sausages. Of course moon cakes (sized like a medium to big muffin) are also a favourite feature. Often, moon cakes have egg yolks baked into the middle, giving a kind of lunar radiance to the center of the cake. The yolk is said to be the cake's "moon". Outside the yolk is a filling of some kind of paste such as, mung bean or red bean. However they can also be filled with ice cream. Moon cakes are best served with endless cups of local green or Red Jade Black Tea.

Lunar New Year is another special occasion in Taiwan. One of the traditions is to give a gift of a bright red envelope to family or friends. Taron shared that for him, this meant his parents giving him a red envelope containing money. Legend has it that a monster named "Sui" pat children's head and made them suffer from fever while they are sleeping on New Year's Eve. Thus, parents tried to keep their children awake all night to prevent them from getting sneak attack by Sui. On New Year, a child was given coins to play with for staying up all night, yet the child inevitably fell asleep with coins on the pillow. Sui then appeared and touched the child. These coins were tied together with red string. Nowadays, the coins have transitioned to red envelopes containing a goodwill gift of money.

Other festivals include the Lantern Festival and Dragon Boat Festival which are special highlights within the culture.

Taron shared many other aspects about Taiwan, a country with 23 million people, including his admiration for and desire to emulate basketball stars like Jeremy Lin and badminton stars like Tai Tzu-Ying.
