

Guest Speaker Emilia Muriti – Youth Parliament

The YMCA South Australia Youth Parliament gives youth like herself a platform to have their say on important issues and to build skills and parliamentary understanding through focusing on personal development, empowerment and connecting parliamentarians with youth voices and opinions. Emilia, a Year 11 Trinity student participates in many youth initiatives such as the youth advisory panel with the council & through the Gawler Enviro centre.

As an outcome of participating, Emilia confidently shared that she is among the next generation of leaders and will not go unheard. She feels so grateful to have attended the SA Youth Parliament equipping her with skills to give back to the community.

Every year young leaders come together through this initiative to learn about public speaking, parliamentary etiquette and youth advocacy, sharing big ideas and discussing challenges facing SA, creating solutions involving community consultations and decision making.

Through collaboration with other young people Emilia gained life-enhancing experience with leadership, public speaking and teamwork. This has meant she has grown as a person, empowered and equipped to be a change maker within the community, through debating Bills, motions of public importance and participating in a very lively reenactment during question time.

Emilia developed skills as she led debate, being the main sponsor of a

proposed Regional Incubator Establishment Bill. Her role involved introducing this bill to the Parliament as the youth treasurer of SA. The bill was created in recognition that regional businesses are struggling due to unavailability or inaccessibility of human resources and facilities. Unfortunately, the bill was voted down in both houses, which after several months of planning and research, was described as a gut-wrenching result. However, defeated bills were still sent to relevant ministers and this bill provided a valuable opportunity for discussion with Catherine Hutchesson (State Member for the electorate of Waite) who was trying to implement a similar program in her electorate and who declared that Emilia's Bill demonstrates to the Parliament that this is what young people are advocating for.

Other bills impacting Youth were debated, including removing aggressive infrastructure in the cities; the youth cultural opportunity bill in recognition of difficulties for low-income refugee and regional youth; and banning Vaping. Even with so many tuff local issues being tackled throughout the week of sitting, positive and mutual respect and a genuine desire to work together was demonstrated to achieve positive outcomes for our community and society.

On the final day participants could do a 2 minute speech on any topic. Emilia learnt about one participant's deep obsession with coffee, while another shared about the Barbie movie and yet another about the practical implications of creating a nationwide library system.

Emilia, as Treasurer, presented a passionate Budget Speech which included 3 million dollars into tree scarfs to keep trees warm in winter. Emilia and her peers met with important stakeholders including Steven Marshall former premier of SA, Chris Pickton, the minister for health, and Tammy Franks, a member of the legislative council.

Emilia is immensely grateful to Rotary for empowering young individuals such as herself & in providing a platform for sharing responsibilities & transforming ideas.

"Participating in the Youth Parliament allowed me to connect with other community minded youth and develop other skills including public speaking and appreciating the importance of collaboration, leadership and teamwork. It has also made me keen to further develop my skills and give back to the community. I was able to connect with so many like minded young people forming friendships; sharing unique experiences and opinions; understanding in depth how the Australian political system works; the importance for leadership and teamwork; and the value of effective community consultation. Most importantly I want to use my experiences to give back to the community and encourage other young people to advocate for issues that they are passionate about."

Response to Questions:

The youth parliament develop bills through meeting fortnightly and the bills are presented and debated from July.

I heard about it through friends who have highly recommended it.

You made good contacts, have you continued to develop these? Yes _ I have joined LinkedIn

Do you want to go into politics? Yes, but not in a public space, but more behind the scenes in policy development.

How many people were on the programme? – 100.

Transport—Joan provided the buses to transport participants to Belair each Day

Was Parliament what you thought? More women in this parliament and less yelling than appears in the real parliament.


Vote of Thanks


