Guest Speaker: Rob Eley – Gallipoli

- Spoke about Anzac Day and showed photographs from his visits to Gallipoli
- The Australians landed at what became known as Anzac Cove on 25 April 1915, and they established a tenuous foothold on the steep slopes above the beach. During the early days of the campaign, the allies tried to break through the Turkish lines and the Turks tried to drive the allied troops off the peninsula. Concerted but unsuccessful allied attempts to break through in August included the Australian attacks at Lone Pine and the Nek. All attempts ended in failure for both sides, and the ensuing stalemate continued for the remainder of 1915
- The original Lone Pine tree died but was replaced using a seed from a tree in Australia which had been grown from a seed from the original Lone Pine
- Private Simpson found himself at ANZAC Cove on 25 April 1915, and was killed less than four weeks later. Instructed to recover and help the wounded he undertook this work enthusiastically. Famously, he used a small donkey to carry men down from the front line, often exposing himself to fire. The bravery of this "man with the donkey" soon became the most prominent symbol of Australian courage and tenacity on Gallipoli
- From Johnston's Jolly looking towards the beach and in the distance Suvla Bay. On the right is the prominent feature of the Sphinx and to the left the flat land of Plugge's Plateau. In the foreground are still existing trenches and tunnels in which may be found bones, shells, cartridge cases and other detritus of war.
- Cape Helles is the rocky headland at the southwestern most tip of the Gallipoli peninsula, Turkey. It was the scene of heavy fighting between Ottoman Turkish and British troops during the landing at Cape Helles at the beginning of the Gallipoli Campaign in 1915.
- The Beach Cemetery was named from the 7th Australian Field Ambulance, which landed on Gallipoli in September 1915, but over 350 of the graves were brought in from earlier cemeteries after the Armistice
- The Embarkation Pier Cemetery, Gallipoli takes its name from a short-lived pier which existed for only two days close to the site of the present cemetery.
- Mustafa Kemal Ataturk wrote the famous words that reached out to the mothers of his former enemies. "Those heroes that shed their blood And lost their lives. You are now lying in the soil of a friendly country. Therefore, rest in peace. There is no difference between the Johnnies And the Mehmets to us where they lie side by side Here in this country of ours, You, the mothers, Who sent their sons from far away countries Wipe away your tears, Your sons are now lying in our bosom And are in peace After having lost their lives on this land they have Become our sons as well".

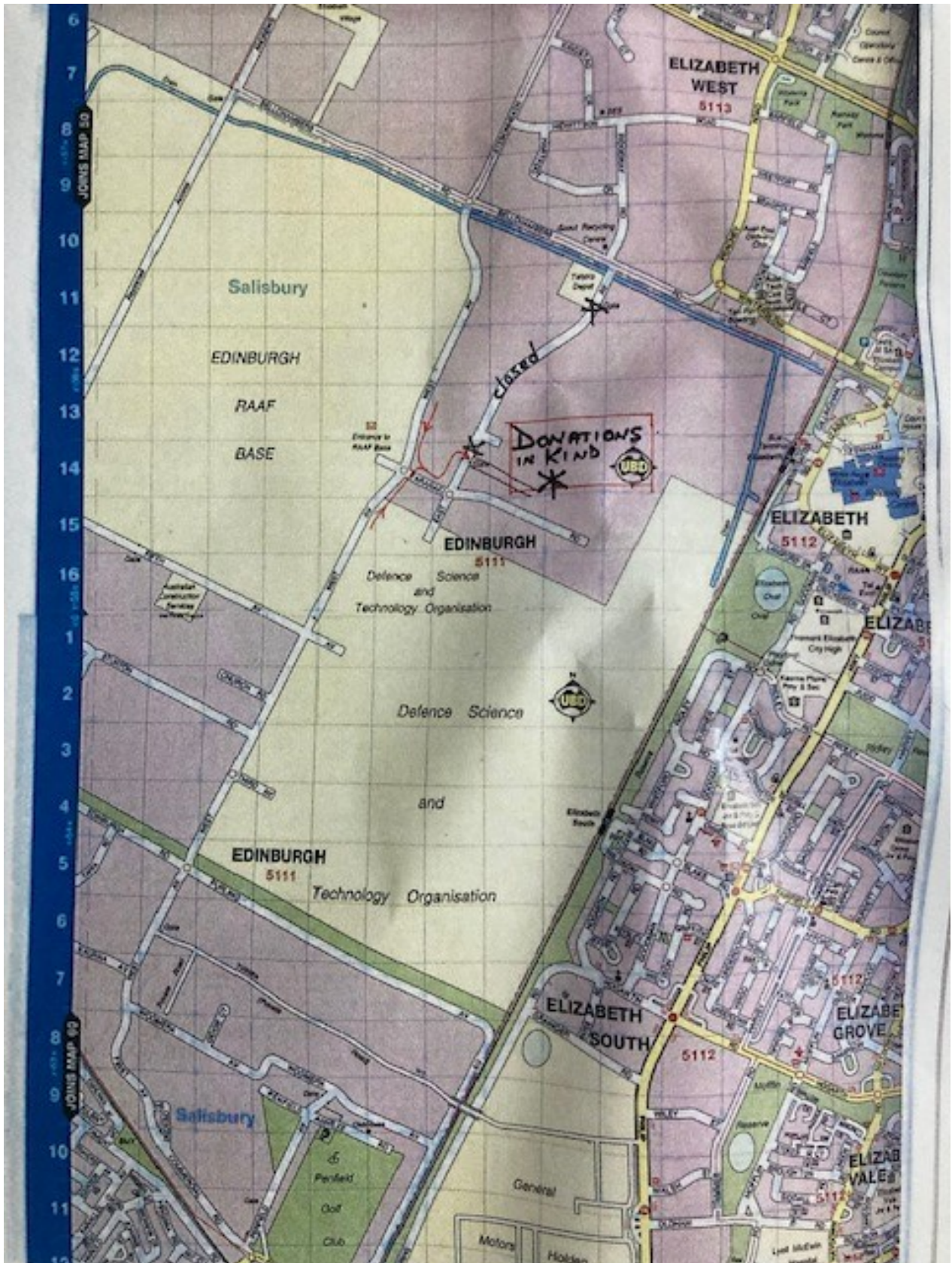
