<u>Guest Speaker:</u> Duncan Power – Outgrower Project Update October 2020

- Cambodian chicken project seeded by funds from Dana Asia (notfor-profit grants organisation) and sponsorship from RCGL. Training and support by KJC (social business company).
- Difficult time with Covid restrictions on international travel.
 Zoom meetings not quite as effective as on the ground.
- Cambodia is relatively free from the virus but the economy is almost shut down. No tourism which was a large part. Flights to and from the area recently increased from zero to one or two per day.
- This has meant realigning the project business model to deal with
 the pandemic situation. Chicken
 sales now mainly to locals and
 NGOs (who distribute food to the
 very poor). Previously the majority
 of the sales went to restaurants
 for the tourist trade.
- No additional family income from other work or work outside the country.
- Project farm managers Mr & Mrs Sokum are however doing well despite lower returns. After completing the cycle for the first batch of 500 chickens they are keen to expand the business by an additional 500.
- First batch. 500 head. Sold 410.
 Lost 90. Total profit USD 164
 (AUD 230). Goal is USD 250.

- Mr and Mrs Sokum send their thanks to RCGL for sponsorship of the sheds and are very grateful for the daily help they get from KJC.
- Key Learnings
 - Need extra training sessions in biosecurity to reduce chicken mortality rate.
 - KJC training to be more strictly assessed to ensure the farmers are more confident before chickens are placed with them.
- Problems encountered with supply of chicken vaccines due to Covid border controls.
- Vaccines from pharmaceutical company Bayer previously obtained via a reputable supplier in Vietnam, however, since the pandemic they have only been able to supply a lower standard product from China.
- The results have been obvious in higher mortality rates. Now KJC/Dana Asia have been able to forge a deal directly with Bayer in Ho Chi Min City.
- Obtaining live chickens from hatcheries in Vietnam has also been stopped however eggs are classed as food and not restricted. Therefore now moving toward hatching own eggs and developing a breeding stock. Hatch rate 5% lower still a mystery.

End Polio Campaign Update

- Year to date figures for 2020 only 104 cases of wild polio virus confined to Afghanistan and Pakistan.
- 17 countries reported (total 303)
 cases of vaccine derived polio.
 This side-effect is unfortunate and
 is being enhanced by the low or
 sporadic coverage of ongoing vac cination programs due to Covid
 pandemic restrictions.
- A new vaccine is being developed that doesn't contain a strain of the live virus which it is hoped will overcome this effect.
