# <u>Guest Speaker</u>: Rob Eley—The Lost Boys—WWII airmen finally laid to rest

- Four Australian airmen shot down on a bombing mission over Berlin nearly 60 years ago received a full military burial in Germany in July 2003.
- Pilot Ivan Durston from Brisbane led the World War II mission to bomb Berlin from RAF Waddington in Lincolnshire in the early hours of January 29, 1944.
- But less than three hours later at 3.25am, the Lancaster bomber was shot down 40 kilometres north of its target, killing all seven men on board, including three British crew.
- For 57 years, Durston, who was 32, wireless operator Robert Ludlow, 31, from Glen Niven in Queensland, 20-year-old upper gunner Phillip Gill from Brisbane and rear gunner Jack Sutherland, 22, from Adelaide - members of Royal Australian Air Force 467 squadron - had been listed as missing.
- They finally received recognition with full military honours in front of 10 members of their families who flew from Australia to attend the service at the crash site near Oranienburg.

- Australia's Chief of Air Force Air Marshal Angus Houston unveiled a plaque at the site and the service was followed by a burial at Berlin 1939-45 War Cemetery.
- The wreckage of Lancaster ED 867 was found by German aviation historians in 2001 in a forest near Oranienburg.
- RAAF officials identified the plane and its occupants by the wreckage and personal effects and immediately started planning a military burial.
- A search of the area at the time only recovered the body of British bomb aimer Sidney Griffiths who was buried in a local cemetery and later moved to Berlin 1939-45 War Cemetery.
- More than 20,000 allied airmen are still listed as missing.
