<u>Guest Speaker:</u> PDG Marie Dorrington: Interplast

- Joined Rotary in 1997, because of the involvement in Rotary Youth Programs of students at St Mary's College, Adelaide, where she was Principal
- Subsequently, found herself involved at District level in a range of roles from Club President (twice) to District Governor in 2012-13, and including District Learning and Development Team Leader, District Membership, Coordinator and RI Coordinator Interplast Australia and New Zealand
- Has been actively involved in Interplast
 Australia and New Zealand since 2013,
 when she was asked to join the Interplast Board, as well as become a member of the Interplast Rotarian Committee, becoming Chair in 2015.
- Still a member of the Board and of the Rotarian Committee, and is now also on the Board Executive, is Company Secretary, and also Chair of the Interplast Design, Monitoring and Evaluation Committee.

- She travelled with an Interplast Surgical Team to Tonga in 2012.....a truly remarkable experience!
- 5 billion people do not have access to safe affordable surgical and anaesthetic care when needed
- 143 million additional surgical procedures are needed each year to save lives and prevent disability
- Just 6% of all surgical procedures undertaken each year are performed in the world's poorest countries
- Prior to COVID 17 partner countries were supported across the Asia Pacific region
- During the last two years 38 countries were supported
- 15873 mentoring hours plus 90835 webinar hours were delivered to surgeons, anesthetics, nurses and allied health professionals
- 67 surgical patients were supported remotely from July 2020 to June 2021
- Promise to partners encompasses:
 - Exceptional patient care
 - Building a sustainable workforce
 - Strengthening hospitals and clinical institutions
 - Working to create systemic change



Rotary Information: lan Curtis

Paul P. Harris was born in Racine, Wisconsin. At age three, when his family fell on hard times, they moved to Vermont to live with Farris' paternal grandparents.

He attended Princeton University, the University of Vermont and the University of Iowa. For the next five years he worked odd jobs as a salesman and reporter for a newspaper, on fruit farms, as an actor, a cowboy, and on cattle ships that traveled to Europe.

Harris eventually settled in the Beverly neighborhood of Chicago, where he lived until his death in 1947. He began his law practice in 1896 in Chicago.

In 1905 Harris organized the first Rotary club "in fellowship and friendship" with three business associates (Silvester schele. Gustavus Loehr and Hiram Shorey)

His initial goal was to create a club of professional and businessmen for friendship and fellowship. Early on, Harris realized that Ro-

tary needed a greater purpose.

While Harris served as president the Chicago Rotary Club in 1907, the club initiated its first public service object, the construction of public toilets in Chicago.

This step transformed Rotary to the world's first service club.
